

Easy Fun Fall Crafts and Treats

The Legacy at North Augusta appreciates the importance of time with family. We've compiled three easy, kid-friendly projects that are perfect for fall afternoons or Halloween parties. Each craft comes with step-by-step instructions and uses materials you likely already have at home.

Pumpkin Rice Krispie Treats

Shape Rice Krispies and marshmallow mixture into pumpkin balls, adding pretzel sticks for stems and using green icing to create leaves.

Ingredients:

- 6 cups Rice Krispies cereal
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 4 cups mini marshmallows
- Orange food coloring
- Pretzel sticks
- Green icing tube

Steps:

1. Melt butter in a large saucepan over low heat.
2. Add marshmallows and stir until fully melted.
3. Stir in orange food coloring.
4. Remove from heat and add Rice Krispies cereal, stirring until well coated.
5. Shape the mixture into small pumpkin balls and insert a pretzel stick on top as the stem.
6. Draw leaves with icing.

Ghost Handprint Art

Create spooky ghost handprints by pressing white paint-covered hands onto black paper, then adding faces with a marker.

Materials:

- Black construction paper
- White paint
- Black marker

Steps:

1. Paint a child's hand with white paint.
2. Press the hand onto the black construction paper, with fingers pointing downward.
3. Once the paint dries, draw two black eyes and a spooky mouth on the palm to create a ghost face.



Fall Leaf Decoupaged Pumpkin

Go for a walk and collect as many pretty fall leaves as you want. Leaves that have recently fallen off the branches are the best to work with.

Materials:

- Colorful fall leaves
- Pumpkin
- Decoupage paint
- Sponge paint brush

Steps:

1. Coat the top of your leaves with the decoupage. Allow time to dry.
2. Coat the back of the leaves with decoupage and press onto pumpkin. Allow time to dry.
3. Paint the entire pumpkin and leaves with decoupage and allow to dry.
